

Notes for Contributors

General

Buried History is published in hard copy and is placed with searchable e-libraries. All Papers published by Buried History are refereed. Brief communications, book reviews are also invited for consideration.

Copy should be provided to the editor electronically on a DVD, CD or email and also in hard copy. The electronic text file should have versions of the paper in MS Word and Text Rich Format.

Illustrations are requested in JPG, PNG, PDF or PSD file format, and at a size and resolution that can be published at 300dpi for the size of illustration intended in the paper. Tables and charts should be in MS Excel or as a PDF. Illustrations and diagrams may also be provided in hard copy or slides. Hard copy is requested to be larger than the size to be published, but no larger than A4.

Electronic copy should not be formatted. Tabs and bold-faced should not be used and there should not be an extra line spacing between paragraphs.

Fonts and symbols used, other than Times New Roman and Arial, should be included on the disk or in the email.

Papers

Papers should generally be between 3000 and 10,000 words. Papers should be set out with:-

- Title
- Author's Name
- Abstract of about 150 words
- Text with headings and subheadings, preferably not numbered.
- Author's name, affiliation and contact details
- Bibliography
- A short biography of the Author should be included.
- Captions for any illustrative material should follow.

Bibliographic format:

References should follow the Harvard convention of in-text referencing, for example (Smith 1997: 32).

The References should be listed with the following format:

Kirkbride, D. 1966 Five Season at the Prepottery Neolithic Village of Beidha in Jordan, *PEQ* 98, 5-61.

Lambert, W.G. & A.R. Millard 1969 *Atra-Hasis: the Babylonian story of the flood*, Oxford: Oxford University Press.

Ben-Tor, A. 1987 The Small Finds, in A. Ben-Tor & Y. Protugali (eds.) *Tell Qiri-A Village in the Jezreel Valley*, Qedem 24, Jerusalem: The Hebrew University of Jerusalem, 236-43.

Endnotes may also be used.

Book Reviews

Book reviews should be between 500-1500 words. They should begin by referencing the book to include author, title, publisher, date, pages, illustrations, cover type, price and ISBN.

The review should conclude with the name and affiliation/contact details of the reviewer.

Brief Communications

Brief communications should have less than 3000 words and should address a specific issue or describe a particular situation. The arrangements for papers should be adopted.
