He is currently director of the German Archaeological Institute excavations at Miletus (Turkey), the Athenian Kerameikos (Greece), Kalapodi (ancient Phokis, Greece) and the Samos Heraion (Greece). Prof Niemeier is widely published and well respected in his field, as evidenced by the many guest lectures he has delivered throughout Germany, the USA, Great Britain, France, Belgium, Denmark, Sweden, Russia, Austria and now Australia as the 2007 AAIA Visiting Professor.
